


## MARCH NEWSLETTER 2018

**EAST RUSTON OLD VICARAGE GARDENS, NORFOLK - WEDNESDAY 13<sup>th</sup> JUNE** A contemporary 32 acre garden, having been created from 1973 with exotic and unusual plants in stunning combinations. There are rose gardens, a Mediterranean border, wildflower meadow, vegetable and cutting gardens, lawns and topiary, woodlands and much more. Including coach & entry, cost is £24, non members £27. With 9.45am start from Girton Church. Bookings close 10<sup>th</sup> May.

**HELMINGHAM HALL GARDENS, SUFFOLK - WEDNESDAY 18<sup>th</sup> JULY** Surrounding a historic moated manor house, there are two modern rose gardens - one in 'Tudor style', with herbaceous borders, plus walled kitchen, knot, herb and wild gardens. Including coach & entry, cost is £19, non members £22. With 10am start from Girton Church. Bookings close 13<sup>th</sup> June.
