**VISIT WEDNESDAY 26th JUNE.** We will go to **Easton Walled Garden** Grantham NG33 5AP [www.visiteaston.co.uk](http://www.visiteaston.co.uk) The gardens have been developed over centuries and cover 2 acres with many different areas including meadows, alpines, a cottage garden, a white garden and, of course, their famous sweet peas which should be at their best when we go. The trip will cost £23 including the coach and entry fee. We will leave Girton Church bus stop at 9.30 am and arrive back at about 5pm.

**VISIT WEDNESDAY 17<sup>th</sup> JULY.** We will go to **Wrest Park** near Silsoe MK45 4HR [www.english-heritage.org.uk/visit/places/wrest-park](http://www.english-heritage.org.uk/visit/places/wrest-park) . This is a 90 acre historic park with parterres and borders reflecting French, Dutch, Italian and English landscaping design. Expect to walk quite long distances to explore the whole park. The mansion House, Orangery and Drawing Room may also be open. The trip will cost £23 including the coach and entry fee. If you are an English Heritage member then entry with your card is free and you will only pay the coach fare of £13. We will leave at 9.15 am from the Girton Church bus stop, returning around 5.00pm.
